



Zero Tolerance Policy

As part of the policy, the Head Coach (must be named on score sheet) may ask questions in a polite and respectful manner during quarter breaks, half time and during a time out.

Disqualification of a Coach or Player as part of this policy must be reported to BWA and will be automatically suspended for the next WABL game.

Officials will stop the game when the parents/spectators displaying inappropriate and disruptive behavior interfere with other spectators or participants of the game. The officials will identify violators to the stadium staff for the purpose of removing parents/spectators viewing the game area. Once removed, play will resume. This inappropriate and disruptive behavior shall include:

- Using obscene or vulgar language in a boisterous manner to anyone at any time.
- Taunting players, coaches, officials or other spectators by means of baiting, ridiculing, threatening physical violence or physical violence.
- Throwing any object on court or physically interfering with on court proceedings.

Any violators will be escorted from the facility and not permitted to return until the next day.

Players or coaching staff under 18 will be escorted from the playing area into the reception area if a parent or guardian not present.
